- Tell the difference between things made by nature and things made by people. Also, tell if something is living or non-living by looking at its features.
- Understand how plants and animals are different
- Learn about the human body, know the main body parts, and what they do.
- Know why keeping clean and healthy is important, and learn ways to take care of the body.
- Find out what air is made of, why clean air matters, and what causes air pollution, along with how to reduce it.
- Learn where we get water from, how we store it, why water shortage is a problem, and simple ways to save water like collecting rainwater.
- Understand why food and nutrients are important to stay healthy, and explore different ways to cook and different kinds of stoves.
- Learn what animals eat, tell the difference between animals that eat plants, animals, or both, and sort animals based on what they eat and how their bodies are built.
- Look at birds and learn about their habits, feathers, beaks, and how they survive.
- Learn the parts of a plant, what each part does, and why plants are important for food, oxygen, and materials.
- Observe the weather in different seasons and how they affect our lives.
- Understand why the Sun is important and learn some facts about it.
- Find out how shadows are made and see how shadows change during the day as the Sun moves.
- Learn about the solar system, know the planets, and tell the difference between planets close to the Sun and those farther away.
- Understand why we need homes, learn about different types of houses, and why keeping homes clean and nice is important.
- Know why people travel, and learn about different ways of moving from one place to another.
